Phase 2 programs were underway following a welldeserved break during break up in Saskatchewan. Seeding is wrapped up for most farmers and now we get into remediation and reclamation season. In June we will see some remediations in the south and northwest regions of the province.

The technical groups have been submitting variance requests to the MER with great success which not only shows the great work the RE is doing with Phase 2 ESA's but is also helping our clients get closure on their sites.

We will be completing vegetation monitoring on LLB and SGS pipelines and ramping up for a busy DSA season.

A large-scale reclamation program will be starting up in southern SK.

As ASCP programs are wrapping up, we will be transitioning to our client's regular ARO programs come the fall.

We are all looking forward to a busy field season.

Reflecting back on our workload for the month of May, the Ridgeline Response team was called to action on 45 new spill response related projects and throughout the month responded to 42.1% of the releases posted to the Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) Compliance Dashboard. We have recently had some changes to our office location in Lloydminster.


Change is always good and with that, we have moved our office location to the following address. If you are shipping anything to this location, its important that you have the updated information as below:
